INFORMATION ABOUT NASAL SPRAY FLU VACCINATION IN SCHOOLS FOR CHILDREN FROM 36 TO 59 MONTHS (3 TO 4 YEARS)

Why it is important for children up to five years to be vaccinated against influenza

Prevention is essential for protecting children's health. Influenza (Flu) can be a major health problem in children under five. It leads to many Primary Care (GP) visits and hospital admissions, sometimes with serious conditions.

Who should get the nasal spray flu vaccine at school?

Flu vaccination is recommended for all children from six months to five years. The nasal spray vaccine is suitable for children over two years. It is part of school programmes for children in the first and second year of pre-school education. In particular, children aged 36 to 59 months (3 and 4 years) are vaccinated against influenza in schools with the Fluenz nasal spray vaccine. Technical details at this link.

Contraindications for the nasal spray flu vaccine

The nasal spray flu vaccine is not suitable for children with the following conditions:

- Severe allergies to eggs or egg products.
- Serious immune system problems, either congenital or caused by medical treatments.
- Prolonged treatment with salicylates, either oral or topical.
- Recent asthma attacks, especially in the three days before vaccination.

In such cases, the vaccine should be given intramuscularly (injected) at your usual clinic.

Also, the nasal spray vaccine is not recommended for children who are in contact with people with severely weakened immune systems, such as transplant recipients. However, it is crucial to vaccinate these children (with an injection) to avoid the risk of infecting the person with a weakened immune system.

Side effects of the nasal spray flu vaccine

This vaccine is safe and has been used in many countries with good results. The most common reaction is nasal congestion, although there may be other symptoms such as loss of appetite or feeling tired. In case of fever or discomfort, give the child paracetamol.

Why influenza vaccination is done at school

Easy access to vaccination is essential. Going to the health clinic during working hours is difficult for many families. Vaccinating at school is simpler. Experience in other countries has shown that school vaccination is an effective strategy. Also, the nasal spray administration of the vaccine is painless, so it is ideal for children.
